Dear families,

Naa marni (Are you all good?) We have enjoyed getting to know you and your child, and look forward to continuing to learn more about their special interests and unique characters. We appreciate that they are very special to you! It's been great to chat to parents and carers during drop offs and pick ups. Please keep up the communication!

It can take some time for children to meaningfully connect with Kindergarten peers and educators, which helps them to develop the confidence to separate from their primary caregivers. Please make a time to speak to one of us (if you haven't already) about your child's transition. We will make a plan together, to support your child while they get used to being away from you. Some children benefit from shorter days (knowing they are going home after lunch is good), or a specific time you will stay for (e.g. one story, one puzzle, ten minutes)

Please also remember to let us know anytime if anything changes in your child's life, or something happens that might affect their happiness and wellbeing. Significant events such as moving house or having a very busy weekend can have a huge effect on your child's time at Kindergarten. Sharing information with us will help us to be aware of your child's individual needs, and support them as best we can. Thank you.

Please help!

Are you able to collect paper-towel/baking paper cylinders for our making table? No toilet paper rolls please, for hygiene reasons. Thanks!

Please pack children's morning snack IN your child's bag, and lunch in a SEPARATE lunch-box/bag. Lunches in black trolleys please. Thanks!

Allergies/medical conditions

One of our children is <u>allergic to eggs</u>. Please no egg cartons for the making table (we will use egg replacement in cooking on Tues/Thurs) Children are still able to pack lunches and snacks containing egg, however we will be closely supervising all eating times.

If your child develops an allergy or medical condition during the year, please let us know immediately so that we can update our records.

Early Years Learning Framework for Australia: Belonging, Being, Becoming.

One of the core themes of the Early Years Learning Framework, which we use to formulate the programme for the children at Kindergarten, is 'Belonging'. Children first develop a sense of belonging to their own family and culture, but this also extends to their neighborhood and their wider community. To help children access all learning opportunities at Kindergarten, they require a strong sense of belonging. In term 1 we will focus on supporting children to make connections with their peers, their teachers and the indoor and outdoor environments, through stories, games, conversations, experiences and educator scaffolding during children's play and interactions. Please feel free to speak to any of the educators if you have any concerns or questions about anything, so that we can help you and your child feel welcome at Kindergarten.

Seesaw and learning journals

Each child will soon have a learning journal in which we will collate information about their learning and development and samples of their work. We will also post these entries electronically to their private page on our Seesaw account. Your child's unique QR code has been placed in their notice pocket (if you haven't got it, please check in the outside foyer next time you are in).

Newsletters, reminders and notifications will be posted on Seesaw and emailed. We intend to minimise our paper and toner usage this year, so if you will require hard -copies of newsletters please let Bianca or Hayley know.


Update on chickens

Aboriginal education

We have begun to introduce some Kaurna words and phrases to the children. At morning group time we ask them "Naa marni?" (Are you all good?) and they can respond "Marni ai" (I am good) or "Kuku ai" (I am sick). "Ninna marni" is used when addressing one person. If you're interested in extending this learning, search for "Kaurna Warra Pintyanthi" on YouTube!

In a few weeks, we will welcome Kaurna elder Uncle Tamaru to our Kindergarten community. We can't wait to learn from Uncle Tamaru!
